

The **Leadership Scholarship Program** recognizes outstanding high school graduating seniors who have achieved excellence in leadership. Four high school seniors from out-of-state and twenty-one from Arizona will be selected for LSP. Established in 1977 to develop exceptional leadership skills among promising scholars, this program has a long-standing history at Arizona State University. More than a scholarship program, students become integral members of the university community.

Students in the program will participate in the following:

- CED 194, a leadership development course designed specifically for this program.
- One-on-one mentoring by an ASU staff member.
- Monthly meetings with all current ASU LSP students.
- Social activities, such as a weekend retreat and holiday events.
- Community service.
- Networking with Leadership Scholarship Program alumni.
- Living on the campus of their major (required for first-year recipients).

Financial Award

The LSP award is one of ASU's institutional scholarships. ASU does not combine institutional scholarship awards. In the event you become qualified for a New American University Scholarship award (i.e., President's, Provost, Dean's) and are selected for the Leadership Scholarship Program, you will only receive the scholarship with the highest value. If accepted into the Leadership Scholarship Program, participation is mandatory. The LSP award is a \$13,000 annual scholarship for nonresident students, renewable for three additional years (eight semesters total). Recipients may use the scholarship for tuition and fees, housing and other educational expenses.

Eligibility Requirements

Must be an active member of Key Club or another nationally recognized leadership organization; 3.25 unweighted GPA.
Must be able to provide verification of citizenship, permanent residency or other lawful immigration status.
Must have a completed ASU application for undergraduate admission on file by Dec. 2, 2011.

Application Instructions

Please complete the application and submit it with the following by Dec. 2, 2011:

- A copy of your official high school transcript(s) (include ACT/SAT scores if available).
- A list of high school activities (include brief description of organization, dates of participation and leadership positions held).
- A list of community service and volunteer projects (include total hours and dates of participation).
- A list of honors, awards and special leadership programs attended (i.e., classes, workshops, conferences).
- Answer two of the following three questions in essay format (a maximum of two pages per answer):
 - 1) If you could ask three questions to any leader (living or deceased), who would you ask, what would the questions be and why?
 - 2) In your opinion, who is more effective and why: one who leads by outward action or one who leads by silent example? Which type of leader are you?
 - 3) If you were asked to give a speech to your peers concerning your "passion" in life, what would your speech sound like?
- Two letters of recommendation (if you are a nonresident, one must be from Key Club sponsor).
